English 9 - Library Research Project - Poster

Statement of Inquiry: Our significance is measured by our contribution to society.

In this unit, you will explore the meaning behind the **statement of inquiry** by completing the following tasks:

1. **RESEARCH**: Choose a person who has made a <u>positive significant contribution</u> to you, the local or the global community. After choosing someone, access at least <u>3 sources</u> of information to learn about this person's contribution. You will have <u>2 class periods</u> to research.

From your research, you may gain the following information:

- 1. **when** the person lived
- 2. **where** he or she lives or lived
- 3. what he or she did to significantly impact you, the local or global community

You may choose to include the above information on your poster. It's up to you. Keep track of your sources because you must cite in-text and create a Works Cited (bibliography) in MLA style. See the Carson Library website for detailed instructions. http://libguides.sd44.ca/carsongrahamlibrary

2. **POSTER**: create a poster about the significant person you've chosen to research. You will present your poster to the class in an informal presentation.

Your poster MUST include the following:

- 1. an explanation of why <u>you think</u> the person you researched has made a significant positive contribution to society
- 2. in-text citations and a Works Cited page (3 or more sources)
- 3. an image or images drawn or printed (cite the source)
- 4. a quote or quotes either spoken/written by or about your significant person (cite the source)

You will have 1 class period to put together your poster.

Your poster and Works Cited will be assessed using Criterion B: Organizing.
