MLA Citation - Referencing Sources in English & Social Studies


To reference sources in English (Criterion B – Organizing) & Social Studies (Criterion C – Communicating), you do 2 things:

Thing #1. write a **Works Cited** list - a bibliography in MLA style Thing #2. write **citations in-text** (instructions on separate handout)

#1. Instructions for how to write a Works Cited list

- A Works Cited is a list of all the sources you used to complete your assignment.
- The list is made up of citations. It's on a separate page from the rest of your work.
- Write your citations first, using a free online citation generator like https://www.citethisforme.com
- Then format your list according to MLA rules.

Here's an example of a Works Cited.



To format your list, complete these steps...

- 1. Open a WORD doc. Write the title Works Cited.
- 2. Arrange your citations in **alphabetical order** A-Z by the first word.
- 3. **Double space** your list. (to do this, highlight all the text > right click > paragraph > spacing > double)
- 4. Use **hanging indent** to format the entire list. (to do this, highlight all the text > right click > paragraph > indentation > special > hanging)

All sources on your list must also be cited in-text.
